

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

### **1. What is a mobility project?**

A mobility project is an outline of the activities / proposal within a given time frame at the host institution.

### **2. What would be the language of instruction at the host institution?**

All EMMA EU partner universities are in non-english speaking countries and teach mainly in the country's national language.

### **3. Will EMMA help in language training?**

Some host institutions offer language training courses for the EMMA awardees. EMMA will reimburse your language training costs in case the course is taken in their own country.

### **3. If I am an alumni of one of the APU member university which mobility is suitable for me?**

You can apply under the TG2 mobility Programme

### **4. What are the required documents for the student mobility?**

- a CV in English in Europass format
- a copy of your most relevant course record transcripts (preferably in PDF)
- a letter of recommendation from home institution

### **5. Do I have to post or email my documents?**

The application for staff or for students must be done online. We do not accept applications or required documents sent through email. You will have to register on the Application Web Site providing a valid email address and a password to login and modify/ update your personal data until the deadline of the application process.

### **6. Can I apply for more than one mobility program?**

If you are a staff member of one of the APU, you may apply for Staff mobility and Student mobility (Master, Doctorate, Post doc), but you can only receive one grant. However if you are a student you can only be considered for one mobility programme.

### **7. Is there any age limit for the staff members who want to apply for one (1) month mobility?**

There is no age restriction for staff members.

## **8. What is the selection criterion?**

The selection process will be based on objective criteria, agreed by all the universities of the EMMA consortium

- academic profile
  - academic performance
  - linguistic ability
  - motivation of the candidate (expressed in the motivation statement included in the application form)
  - candidate commitment with home country
  - level of vulnerability and socio-economic status
  - geographical, institutional, thematic fields and gender balance
